April Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Month

Stop and think for a moment what image comes to mind when you hear the words "child abuse." Typically, one tends to think of a child who has been beaten or battered. And that, most definitely, is one aspect of child abuse.

To understand child abuse you first need to know what child abuse really is. Child abuse is any mistreatment of a child that results in harm or injury and that has no "reasonable" explanation. Child abuse is generally divided into several categories including physical, sexual, emotional, and neglect.

It's difficult to determine exactly how many children are abused and neglected each year. We know that most research is based on cases of child abuse and neglect that have been substantiated by child protective services agencies. These agencies, because of limited resources, are usually only able intervene in cases deemed to be of serious concern. We also know that many cases of abuse and neglect are never even reported.

The most current data report states that:

- ◇ In 2006, over three million reports of child abuse and neglect were made in the U.S., of these reports approximately 896,000 children were found to have been victims of abuse or neglect.
- ◇ 4 children die in the United States each day from abuse or neglect.

In 2006 in Wisconsin there were:

- ◇ 41,294 reports of child abuse
- ◇ 1,251 substantiated cases of physical abuse
- ◇ 2,871 substantiated cases of sexual abuse
- ◇ 50 substantiated cases of emotional abuse
- ◇ 3,313 substantiated cases of child neglect
- ◇ 13 cases of a child having died because of child abuse or neglect

Regardless of what the data says, we believe that one case of child abuse is one case too many. Remember, it should never hurt to be a child.

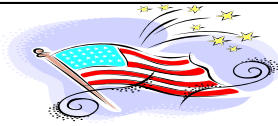

Spring Fun

Crafts/Activities:

Funny Bunny Ears: What you will need; white construction paper, pink construction paper and tape or a stapler. Cut white paper into a band that fits a child's head. Cut out two ears from the white paper. Staple or tape band together and do the same for the ears. Next cut out two smaller ears for the center part. Add a cotton ball to their back and eyebrow pencil to make whiskers. You will have some cute little bunnies hanging around your house.

Paper bag Easter basket: What you will need; small paper bag with rectangular bottom, scissors, crayon, staples, tissue or grass. Cut the bag so that the ears become the handle of the rabbit basket. Then make features for the rabbit face with crayon. Add bits of black paper strips for whiskers to complete the basket. Staple the ears together to make the basket sturdier. Fill the basket with tissue straw or grass. Cutting the tissue into very fine shreds can do this.

Plastic Bottle Mosaic: What you will need; a large plastic coated paper plate, Duco cement, plastic bottles of all colors cut into small pieces, scissors, pencil. You could also use tempera paint, brushes, pipe cleaners, and masking tape. Lay the hand in the center of the paper plate and trace it with a pencil. Next, start to fill in the tracing in mosaic form using the pieces of plastic bottle for tracing. Use scissors whenever necessary to add pieces of plastic to stubborn areas. Continue to add pieces until the entire tracing is filled in mosaic form. Now add mosaic pieces in the area surrounding the hand in another color, or fill the area by painting it with tempera paint. If the paint is used, add a small quantity of liquid soap to the paint; other wise it will not adhere to the plastic coating.

Next attach a pipe cleaner loop on the back of the plate with masking tape if the plate is to be hung.



Zany May Flowers: What you will need; 24 x 36 inch colored construction paper, scissors, assorted colored tissue, paper cement, a bottle of metallic sparklers, scraps of green construction paper. Cut a huge flower shape from the large colored paper. Any shape will do as long as it is big. When the shape is complete begin to crumple and cement pieces of the tissue to the flower shape. The tissue pieces can be arranged in many ways—around the edge to form a border, completely covering the shape, or in spots of design in area of the flower, let your kids decide.

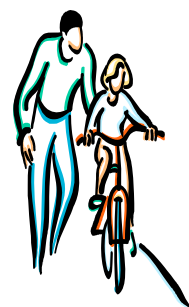

Recipes

EARTH DAY BARS

Recipe Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 C baking mix (Bisquick)
- 1 1/2 C instant oats
- 1 C packed brown sugar
- 1/2 C softened butter
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon



Add Ins: Coconut flakes, chocolate chips, raisens, chopped nuts (optional), chopped dried pineapple.

1. Heat oven to 350. In a large bowl, combine baking mix, oats, brown sugar, butter, egg & cinnamon.

2. Stir the mix until you have a crumbly dough.

Next, fold in 1 C total of the add-ins of your choice.

3. Press the dough into an ungreased 9 x 13 in pan & bake for 17 mins or until center is set and the bars are slightly brown. Allow them to cool for 10 mins before cutting. Makes 1 1/2 dozen 2-by-3 inch bars.

****Also, replace 1/2 of the butter with cinnamon applesauce. Add a few dashes of nutmeg & for fruit use dried tropical fruit bits (mango, papaya & pineapple) EXCELLENT!!
